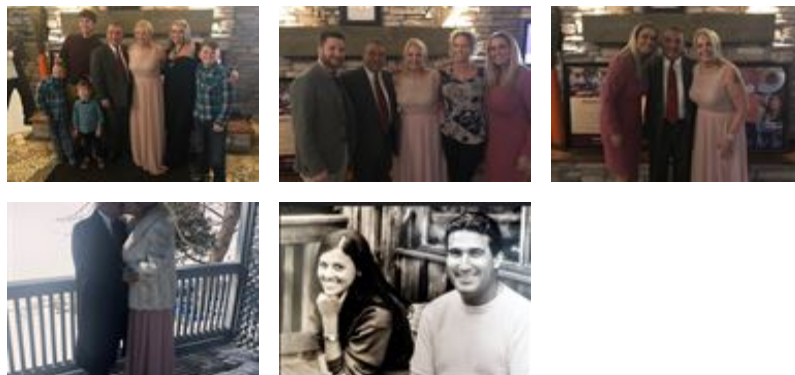

“ Those of us who worked with Alex know we do it to protect soldiers. Sometimes, we actually get to feel it. Before I met Alex, I was part of a team developing a vehicle. Each month 50 or more people would gather to review what had been done and plan for the next month. For one of those meetings, we brought back a crew that had survived a large bomb blast. As the meeting was ending one of the soldiers began to speak. He stopped as tears filled his eyes. The room was silent. He gathered himself and said this. “i’m 38 years old. I have a wife and two young children. If it wasn’t for the vehicle you provided us, I would be dead. My wife would be a widow and my children would not have a father. Next month is Christmas. Thank you for doing what you do.” There are an unknown number of soldiers who are alive because ‘of what Alex did. Their children will have children and more will follow. None of those future generations would be possible without Alex. He knew it and it is why he kept doing all he could.
