Your home always seemed a welcoming place with lots of fun things going on, and I always thought of your family as sort of a brother family to my own. I remember that your family took me to my first Detroit Red Wings game, and that it seemed such a kind thing for you all to get me in on something that was a big part of your life. A Red Wing of part American Indian descent -- maybe his name started with a 'B' -- thrilled the crowd by repeatedly risking his body to block shots from the point, and each time he did the organist played music associated with American Indians -- I still remember this.

Later, for most of my life, Arnold and Marge always sent a birthday card to me. How many people do that? Again, it seemed like an especially kind thing to do, and the cards were always appreciated. Jan and I remember the delightful visit paid us by Arnold and Marge in Cincinnati while you were travelling around. And of course Arnold was always looking to entertain his friends with his findings on the internet -- strange stuff, funny stuff, and informative stuff -- it was another kindness that he showed us and others.
