Arnold Ivan Wilson, age 98, died Tuesday, August 8th, 2023 at The Village of East Harbor, Chesterfield, Mich. Arnold was born in Peterborough, Canada on July 3rd, 1925, the son of William and Addeline Wilson and grew up in Flint.
