January 13, 1925 - May 5, 2020

Eda Sahr of Chesterfield, MI passed away peacefully on Tuesday, May 5, 2020, at The Village of East Harbor at the age of 95. Eda was born on January 13, 1925, in Uniontown, Pennsylvania, and one of six children born to Michele and Antonina (Petricca) Yamarino.
