These classes were very helpful to me getting started in my career. As one of the first COBOL programmers at Chrysler (if not the first), she brought to her students wisdom from the work world, a sense of "reality" and not just academia. She also had a great sense of humor.

Back on December 9, 2013, I heard on the radio that it was the birthday of the late Grace Hopper, one of the inventors of the COBOL computer language. It made me remember my COBOL teacher at Macomb CC. So I searched Google and found Florence Lesnau's phone number. I called her and she was at home. We had a very nice conversation, although she did not remember me at first (but I remember her and her classes). Once I mentioned a few of my classmates, she started to remember a bit about that time period at Macomb.
