We always have that dinner you took me to celebrating You on your birthday in our lifetime.

One of your two homes has a notice on the front door, an eviction and you might even still be being billed for that one and your other house. Are You? They have removed Pooh the bear dipping his paw into the honey pot on your tree I had asked You not to remove and You obliged. Your shed should be saved, the tree they did not.

You are a better person in a better place now that You've finally quit smoking what replaced what you liked to smoke but I cannot believe that I read You died at home. Was it at the one You bought from Joanne or the one next to Linda? I wish the tree in front of it had stayed there to be honest.

Thank you for always thinking of me with fondness. I am sorry I did not answer the door the day that car flipped over on the front lawn next to mine on the fourth day into July with all of those distracting objects in the lawns place but I didn't want him to smell smoke after Covid. Families like Sandy's and Elaine's that do not like OUR United States Armed Forces if not their own spouse, they named in obituaries before while illegally buying our info or transacting with them, that led to our loved ones passing away following that chain letter of Michelle's, that car landed on like my head use to do as I would weep on your shoulder, thank you for those memories. I hate war and abusive men who like only children mothered by one, know no different.

I was not notified in 2022 on or after the fifth day in the last month of the calendar year Clerk Grot promoted a Sargeant who use to drive

around in the North Star van and I would never miss his funeral had I been told. I had not missed my other Grandpas United States Armed Forces last talk before to say goodbye at the hospital with Him before he died and it just feels terrible to not know and not get to say thank you, I love you, I will always think of You, and bye for now. I will make that right throughout my lifetime knowing how to find You and telling You where so many don't have their loved ones notified of their loss and I will visit. I have not gone there by myself but maybe someday in the future times I will. I've made the drive before and survived being blown to smithereens in the car owners place trying to find Conner if he died that Polish Munich wife of Rich hating me and mine not belonging to her and whatever else were her motives raised as an only child after she said that this past year in 2025 after 2018.

My child Conner wrote in school poems he named Alone and Nothing, and are how separated from me he felt in grade school I hope You did not feel, I know he and too many felt. I have felt. His brother has felt without him.

Tell my United States Armed Forces loved ones married to my United States Armed Forces Veterans after 2018 that died in 2022, or in between 2018-2022, 2023, 2024, 2025, as they welcome You where You are that I miss them and I love them too and feel that love from Me to You as you do.

Vast the restaurant before the one at 24 Mile Rd and Van Dyke Road in 48316, identified in the Utica Community Schools class of 2019 graduation video, as where You go when it's your time to die, You and I did not go. I don't agree that is okay as his only Mother and his siblings which you met or to use United States Armed Forces against each other while in our United States of America to effect us abroad because of where they attend church and that being Syrian Ephram Catholic spelled not with an am but ending with our three letter sleep state em so thank you for the love of this nation that we United share, thank you for your time in Service.
