One clear memory I have is of running into cousin Jackie while I was with my son & Michele, she gave me the most beautiful loving smile, she looked gorgeous. I had no idea how sick she must have been on that day, she was the brightest bulb in the whole room to me on that day! What a big heart she had. I will never forget it. It wasn't until days later that I realized my sibling did not pass the message the Priest had given her to ANYONE.
