I wanted to learn how that magic which my Mother enjoyed so much worked. And that night I did. For the first time I was transported somewhere else, experienced 1st hand something entirely new through the power of the written word.*

She was my cub scout pack's Den Mother, and researched crafts and activities for us to take part in. She taught me fairness in dealing with others, explaining why - even though she loved my brother and me - we couldn't expect special treatment... a lesson that was hard to swallow then, but which I've come to see as essential to my moral view of the world.

As my brother and I grew older our house was the nexus where all the neighborhood kids met, and my Mom was always there to listen to their problems or give encouraging advice. Many of my friends came to the house as much to visit her as me. She invited our friends into her house and made everyone comfortable and made everyone feel safe.
