“*Joanne Hall was born at home on March 19th, 1928 a year before the Great Depression hit. At birth her lungs were very small. She was born on Lakeview Drive in Detroit, MI. She was the third of four girls born to Joseph & Anna (Rooney) Snider. As a child she broke her arm roller skating while playing the game “My father owns a store”. Joseph & Anna and the four girls, Mary Jane, Geraldine, Joanne & Patricia (now deceased) then moved to Lakewood St., also in Detroit. Joanne graduated from Girls Catholic Central in 1946. Soon after graduation the family moved to Ypsilanti. She wanted to become a nurse and join the Peace Corps but her life took a different path. After graduation she went to Comptometer School. When she finished schooling there she took a job working with her father at Kaiser-Fraser. She eventually left Kaiser-Fraser and took a job working in banking where she met her husband, Glenn Hall. They married and in 1956 had Stephanie, followed by Michele in 1957 and finally Jennifer in 1967. In 1967, Glen & Joanne divorced and she & the girls moved to Sterling Heights to be near her sister, Geri. Shortly after that, Joanne’s parents, Joseph & Anna, moved to Sterling Heights as well. In 1974, Glen stopped paying child support and Joanne was forced to get a second & third job to make ends meet. She worked very hard her entire life to support her family.*

Joanne had the unique opportunity to help raise each grandchild and have special one on one time with each of them. Her first grandchild, Christopher, was born in 1974. Stephanie & Chris lived with Joanne after Stephanie’s husband, Mark, died. Joanne was able to be an active part of Chris’s childhood and taught him many life lessons that have shaped him into the man he is today. Her second grandchild, Jamie, was born in 1985. Again, Joanne was there to help raise Jamie while Michele & Jamie lived at home with her. She enjoyed taking Jamie out and about on errands every day with her and loved watching Jamie dance and sing around the house (something Jamie still loves doing to this day).

In 1991 Joanne sold her house in Sterling Heights and moved to London, Kentucky. This was a lifelong dream of hers and she loved living among the beautiful mountains. In Kentucky she got a job

working at the roller-skating rink. She baked cakes for the birthday parties there and sewed costumes for the party workers. In 1997 her third and final grandchild, Jacob, was born. Joanne, wanting to help in raising Jacob, moved back to Michigan. She bought a home in Washington Twp. and spent her days taking care of Jacob and again was able to give her love, patience and life lessons to yet another grandchild. She would sit for hours playing with him and shared with him her love of animals. Jenny would often catch her petting Jacob's pet rats.

In 2008 she moved to Macomb Twp to live with Jenny, her husband, Alan & Jacob. She spent these last years worry free and able to enjoy her hobbies. She enjoyed spending the holidays and birthdays with her family which by now had grown from grandchildren to great-grandchildren, Jaden, Alyssa and Casey Jo (named after her) and Chris's wife, Christy, who had become a fourth grandchild to her.

Joanne was always there for her family & friends to offer advice or just to let you vent until you felt better. She was the first one to offer help but had a hard time accepting help herself. She never wanted to "be a burden". She didn't understand that she was such an amazing and kind person that people WANTED to help her.

Everyone that knew her loved her and even if you only met her once you remembered her. She loved her TV programs and had a favorite one that she recorded every day.
