Judy Marie Anderson was born on September 17, 1950 and passed away peacefully at Wellbridge of Romeo Nursing Home on Monday December 11, 2023. She was 73 years old. She is predeceased by her loving parents George and Virginia Andrzejewski and her sister-in-law Laurie Andrzeweski.

Judy grew up in Warren, Michigan graduating from Warren high in 1968. She continued her education at Western Michigan University, earning her Bachelor of Science degree in 1972 to pursue her dream of becoming a teacher. Judy taught elementary school for ten years in the Warren Consolidated School System before being diagnosed with a very challenging mental illness, bipolar disorder. After she stopped teaching Judy spent her time making a difference in the lives of many people by volunteering. She worked at the American Red Cross, the American Cancer Society Resale Shop, and the Sterling Heights Library.

When not volunteering, Judy enjoyed thrifting, gardening, swimming, and doing needlepoint, taking pictures of family and friends and attending events at the local ski club she was a member of. Judy loved her condo in Sterling Heights where she lived for most of her adult life.

Judy had a passion for skiing and met her lifelong boyfriend on the slopes of Northern Michigan. They went on several ski trips over the years.

In 2019 Judy was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease. Her bi-polar disorder progressed and she moved to the assisted living at the Arbor Inn of Warren. After having a bout of COVID in 2022 her Parkinson's Disease progressed and she had to move to Wellbridge of Romeo Nursing Center for additional care. The Family is very thankful to all the staff of the facilities that took care of Judy with such love and grace.

Judy is survived by her boyfriend Dave Duvali, her loving sister Linda (James) Milan, brothers Allen Andrzejewski, and Terry (Debbie) Andrzejewski, and several nieces and nephews. She is loved and will be missed dearly. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, January 13, 2024 at the Wasik Funeral Home, Inc 49150 Schoenherr Rd. (n. of 22 Mile Rd.), Shelby Twp.
