“ I am one of Marge's nephews, one of the sons of her husband's sister. When I was young my family and Marge's family spent many long days together visiting at either the Tash's house or that of my family. I can't think of anyone for whom the gates of heaven will more readily open than for my Aunt Marge.

What I remember most strongly about her was that she was a homemaker in the most complete and laudable way. Her home seemed always a welcoming place, and I always had the sense that it seemed so to her own family, that they felt very secure and well looked-after in her home. There was always good food, and she prepared it and set it out with apparent ease and effortlessness. I never felt like a visitor at her house -- my family was part of her family.

She raised three sons, and whenever I and my brothers got together with them, we were a boisterous bunch. It seemed understood that Marge's house was a place where kids were welcome, and welcome to play sports in the basement and in the yard – in general, act like a bunch of boys. For her, that's what a home was for. We got injured and we broke things. This did little to ruffle Marge -- she was a calm person who could easily get along with, and nurture, growing boys. My guess is that on her own she would have little interest in things like hockey, but with her family, she was an ardent fan.

During the holidays each year Marge baked "spritiz" cookies (that's the name we knew them by), and always made some for my family to take home. For those in her family who remember those cookies, nothing else need be said.

After I was grown Marge lost her hearing, a loss that surely must have been a significant challenge for her. But to me, she seemed little different. She was as interested as ever in communicating with everyone, and she was always interested in things -- she liked to travel and do and experience whatever she could, and her calm and

cheery demeanor stayed as it always had. The adjustments her deafness required of the rest of us were easy to the point of being barely noticeable, because she was still the same old Aunt Marge.

Both my wife, Jan, and I appreciated that Marge always remembered to send us birthday and anniversary cards, every year, without fail – and that's every year, for over forty years. And when our kids were little, she never failed to send each of them a birthday card, with an exciting bit of cash enclosed. What kind of person would keep tabs on a far-flung nephew and his family like this, always remembering, never forgetting through the many years, and the many miles that separated them? A thoughtful, loving, caring person – Marge.

So, I remember Marge as a remarkable person, someone with an air of calm and grace who put others in her orbit at ease. Selfless in that she had a very substantial self, to the point where it didn't a whole lot of tending, and could focus on the other people and interesting things around her. I'm pretty sure that she felt that she had lived a full and rewarding life. For the rest of us, her passing leaves the world just a bit less bright, but memories of her will long continue to be memories of the best a person can be, both for herself, and for all the rest of her family and extended family.
