



Norbert John Skorupski

June 6, 1932 - June 1, 2024

Norbert John Skorupski, resident of Warren for 61 years, died peacefully in his home on June 1, 2024 surrounded by his family. He was 91 years old.

He was born in Detroit on June 6, 1932 to the late Frank and Genevieve (nee Sokolowski) Skorupski. He was the beloved husband of Betty for 65 years. They were married on October 11, 1958 at St. Raymond Catholic Church in Detroit. He is also survived by his loving daughters, Deborah Scott and Sharon (Rodney Lucas) Skorupski and grandsons, Zachery Ramus (Colleen Smith), Trevor Ramus and Andrew Ramus.

He especially enjoyed spending time with his family; skiing, vacationing out of state and camping up north at East Tawas. He later enjoyed taking extended gambling bus trips up north with the "Sno-Poles".

He was an honorable member of the U.S. Army for 2 years and was stationed in Germany for the majority of that time. He was very proud to have served his country.

After his time in the military, he worked for the U.S. Post Office for 33 years. Retiring in 1990, he continued to work various other part-time jobs. He was always eager to lend a helping hand with handyman projects for his family and friends.

He was loved deeply and will be greatly missed by his family and all who knew him.

Family and friends will gather Thursday at 9:30 a.m. until a 10:30 a.m. Funeral Mass at St. Faustina Catholic Church, 14025 Twelve Mile Road (between Schoenherr and Hayes) Warren. He will be laid to rest in Great Lakes National Cemetery.

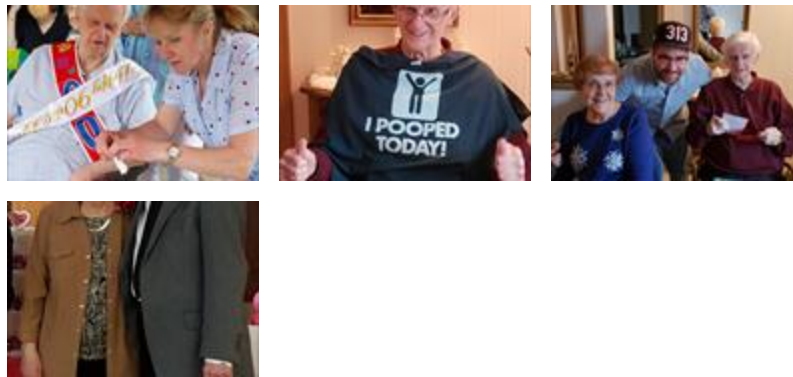
