He was a very active man, kind, always had a great attitude and could always make you laugh. After he had his lung transplant, he showed up at our rehab wearing a mask and not wearing oxygen. I had not seen him in months so I hugged him. He said, "Be careful! Don't hurt my new lung." That's how I found out he had gotten the transplant. Inquiring about it caused him to get emotional and he said, "Talking about it might make me cry because I have a girlie lung." Paul always made me laugh.

I gave him some superman logo knee high socks with red capes sewn to the back of them and told him he was our Superman. He wore them golfing and told me that some of his friends had offered him money for them but he'd never give them up for any amount of money. I could picture him wearing those at the golf course with shorts.

We didn't see him for quite a few years but heard about him because there were always "sightings." He was at the Polish festival dancing or was seen other places enjoying himself.

Our Superman has gone on to his eternal reward. He is a true inspiration and I will never forget him.

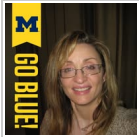
