Philip passed away on Wednesday, April 6, 2022 after a short illness in Charlotte, North Carolina at the age of 76. Phil was a very proud US Army veteran serving our country and earning the Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, and the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. Following his honorable discharge from the Army Philip finished his education earning his bachelor's degree in accounting. Philip entered the workforce taking a position with Schwartz Industries, a leading provider for the Aerospace industry. Philip quickly rose through the ranks of the employees at Schwartz and became a member of their Executive Management team in 1976. 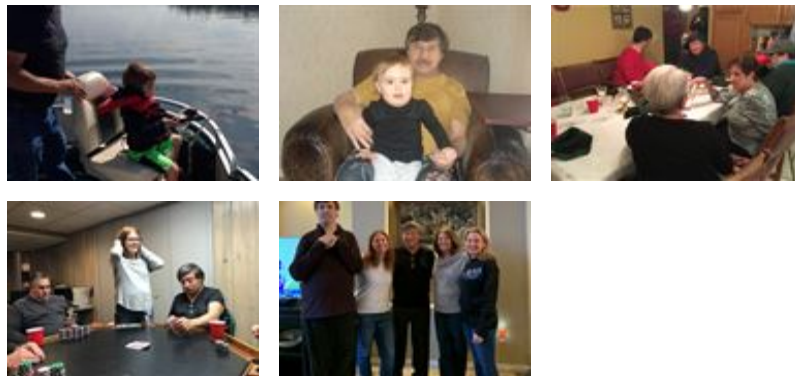
