Robert John "Bob" Pylar, 78, of St. Clair Shores, MI peacefully passed away on Sunday March 21, 2021 at Henry Ford Macomb Hospital in the presence of his family. He was born on March 6, 1943 to Raymond and Leona (nee Konke) Pylar in Detroit, MI and attended St. Joseph High School in Detroit, Class of '61.
