Rod was my mother's (Rita Stephanic Murphy) first cousin, the youngest child of the Bork family, who lived just a few doors down Horton Street from my grandparents, the Stephanics. His mother, my Great-Aunt Agnes, was my grandfather's (Frank Stephanic) older sister. I'm not sure whether that made Rod and me second cousins or first cousins once removed - I've never been clear about the difference between the two. Anyway, we were connected through that warm and supportive Polish community that blossomed in Detroit's SE side during the last century.

When I was a teenager, I occasionally babysat for Rod's kids. There were four of them, babies and toddlers as I recall, including a set of twins. Rod and Sydney were kind enough to put them to bed first before going out and left me good snacks, too (I reciprocated by finishing up any dishes I found in the sink). I can't believe that those children must now be in their fifties or so!

I was touched that, despite all the work and energy this lively brood required of them, Rod and Sydney found time to be together and have some fun. This must have been one of the secrets to their long and successful marriage.

I'm so glad that Rod and I were in touch in the last several years due to the internet and his writing. From my mother, I heard about and ordered his book about growing up in Detroit, and that was the start of our digital reconnection. He sent me jokes and I sent him e-cards. He also sent messages of support and kindness, particularly when I told him about my husband's passing a couple of years ago.

Rod is in my thoughts. I don't know if my mom knows yet, but I will be speaking to her later today. I'm sure she will extend her thought and prayers, as well.
