Our families were very close so Uncle Stanley was a constant presence in my life. Here are a just a couple of my memories:

- *When his family lived on Christy in Detroit we were there a lot. One day I was busy playing – because there was always fun happening with my cousins. Uncle Stanley called my name, but it wasn't my name. He called me "Nanette". I told him that wasn't my name. We stood in the hallway looking at each other. He gave me one of his shy smiles. It was a funny moment.*
- *I was a teenager (you know, that time in a person's life when you know everything). The phone rang at my house and I answered it....saying "Hello?" You could tell someone was there but they wouldn't say anything so I hung up. The phone rang again right away. Once again I said "Hello?" A voice said "Why did you hang up on me?" I recognized the voice as Uncle Stanley. I responded "Because you didn't say anything." I must have never answered the phone before when he called. It was so weird how he didn't say anything. How could I have known?*

Our family was very big....lots of aunts and uncles, and a bunch of cousins. Holidays were packed with craziness. Lots of memories on Coplin and everywhere else we celebrated, including picnics at Chandler Park. Being close with the Welcs I learned early on that Uncle Stanley loved his wife and children very much. He was a quiet man, but you knew the depths of his love. He was kind and never spoke harsh to anyone. He is in a special place now, but he will always be remembered for being a very special member of Our Family.
