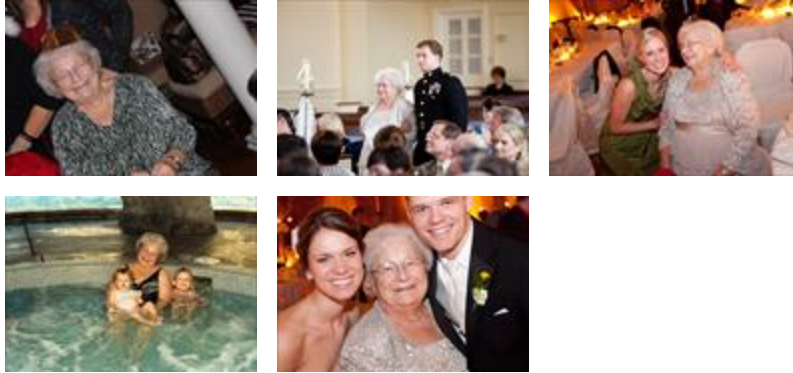

“ This is my beautiful mother! There are so many wonderful things to say about her but the most important thing I want to say is that her faith in Jesus is what got her through life and the promise of eternity in heaven through that faith. Mom was a prayer warrior. I would go to her and ask for prayers and always felt comforted in knowing that she was praying for me and my family. Though I know that she was praying all the time, she had a special hour during the morning that she reserved for praying. I admired this so much that I try set aside the first hour every morning to pray and do my devotions. My husband is an early riser and brings up my coffee every morning, for the past several years now, and sets it on the stand, in our room, next to my chair. Before I leave my room, and life's busy day takes over, I have this personal quiet time and naturally think of my mom and prayed for her. She was a loving, caring, nurturing mother and very dedicated to her 9 children and our families, as well as extended family and friends. My children affectionately call her "Busia" (Polish for grandma). So much I could say about the ways she sacrificially gave to everyone. Mom was 19 years old when she married my dad. Dad owned a bakery in Detroit near Hamtrac. Our big family lived above the bakery in a very small flat. All of us worked in the bakery whether we like it or not!!! My father died over 40 years ago. With 9 children and very little means, mom had plenty of challenges to face in these past forty years, but faith in Jesus, hope and love got her through. To me, she is the perfect example of what a mother should be and I strive to be like her. In the past year and a half, right after mom had a shoulder replacement surgery and major back surgery, she never rehabbed enough to be able to walk again. All 9 of us children, along with a very wonderful caregiver, took care of our bedridden mother in her home where she thrived so much better. Her mind was very good but her body didn't work well. We had the privilege of loving and caring for her completely and unconditionally as she cared for all of us in her almost 89 years of life. We spent a lot of time together as a family, these past couple of years, due to taking care of mom, which I can see evidence that this had to be God's plan. We had a schedule where at least one of her children was always with her day and night. Lots of family parties

and mom having all of her children around her. All but one sister (lives in Houston) live within 20 miles of mom. The sister from Houston would come home, usually every 6 weeks or so, for a long weekend so others could have a break. We stuck together and cared for mom and managed to still get along, maybe better than ever. I believe it was Gods good and perfect will and purpose for our family. We've had many good times in spite of moms circumstances. I know that we would not have spent so much time together if moms conditions were better. So thankful that even though she couldn't walk, her mind was completely healthy. I know mom was happy in her last years of life, even in her conditon, to always have her children around. We were her lifes work and are blessed to call her mom and Busia. Moms final week and a half was very hard. She took a fall in the middle of the night,by somehow rolling out of bed and landed on her knees, which both had knee replacements. She ended up with two broken femurs. The trauma of that was a bit too much for mom. She was in a lot of pain and ended up having a mild heart attack which made it risky for her to have the surgery to fix the femurs. It was a hard decision to make but we felt she needed to get get the broken legs fixed. She made it through the surgery w/out complications but in the end it proved to be too much for her heart to try to heal her. This space won't let me type any more so to be continued.....
